Dr. Jeff Collins is Medical Director of the Massachusetts General Hospital's Urgent Care Center in Chelsea, Massachusetts. He also serves as Medical Director of the MGH Center for Community Health Improvement in Boston. He is a Course Director for the MGH Departments of Medicine, Pediatrics and Medicine/Pediatrics courses in "Urgent Care Medicine" and "Community-Oriented Primary Care." He is an Instructor in Medicine at the Harvard Medical School and a Staff Physician for the New England Revolution MLS soccer team.

Collins serves on the Board of Directors of the Urgent Care Association of America and on the Editorial Board of the **Journal of Urgent Care Medicine**. His current research interests include urgent care utilization patterns, standards of care in urgent care medicine, urgent care subspecialty referral patterns, urgent care roles in outpatient suboxone management and smoking cessation, and adult and pediatric obesity. He has conducted research projects in India, Ethiopia, the Dominican Republic, Mexico and the U.S.

He was a U.S. Department of Education National Graduate Fellow and University Fellow at the University of Rochester School of Arts and Science in the Department of Anthropology.
